Tasks:

- 1. excavate, level and re-dirt fields
- 2. install sod or turf
- 3. install sprinkler system

Why is this so important to our Ma'ema'e School keiki?

- 1. Students need daily outdoor exercise to exert their energy and increase blood flow to the brain which enhances learning. (Ma'ema'e students often have indoor recess due to field repair and maintenance.)
- 2. To promote a positive sense of fair play and self-worth through sports and year-round outdoor activities. (In building the whole child, Ma'ema'e students need physical activity away from computers!)
- 3. our fields are heavily used by our large student population, the A Plus Program and community teams. This results in hard packed, uneven and rocky play areas with many dirt patches.
- 4. Nuuanu's rainy seasons cause run off and uneven fields. Large field sections become unplayable for weeks.
